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1. INTRODUCTION

Farms are a unique environment as they are often both a workplace and a home.

The farm environment provides many positive experiences and opportunities for children. However, they also contain many dangers and potential injury hazards including hazards, including machinery, vehicles (e.g. tractors and motorbikes), animals, water hazards (e.g. dams, rivers, creeks and animal drinking troughs) and poisons (e.g. pesticides).

In 2020/21, **441 Victorian children** aged 0-14 years were treated in hospital as a result of an injury sustained on a farm. Alarmingly, this is a **12% increase** on the previous year and the largest number since 2018/19.

Farm safety is an important issue not only for children and families who live on a farm, but also for those who visit farms. Kidsafe Victoria is running the 'Farm Safety Creative Competition' for Victorian preschoolers and primary school students to raise awareness of farm safety among children and their families. This project is supported by the Victorian Government through the Smarter, Safer Farms Program.

2. THE COMPETITION

The Farm Safety Creative Competition is designed to provide an interactive way for children to learn about potential injury hazards that exist in farm environments and strategies that can be put in place to help keep the whole family safe. Not only will the competition help children to learn about the importance of keeping safe on the farm and get creative, there are also fantastic prizes available for winning entries!

The competition invites all Victorian children aged 3 to 5 years to enter a creative submission in the 'Early Childhood Category'. The category encourages preschoolers to gather their craft materials and create a poster or collage based on this year's theme, 'Farm Safety Heroes'.

The theme centres around how we can all play a part in making the farm a safe experience for everyone, whether we live, work on, or are visiting a farm. We're encouraging everyone to be a real life 'Farm Safety Hero' and ensure we all work together to keep our current and future generations safe.

Competition entry is free and children can enter as a class, in pairs/teams, or individually. Entries can be completed through early childhood centres and submitted by educators, or completed at home and submitted by parents/carers.

The winning entries from the competition will be utilised to form the basis of a month-long farm safety education campaign through Kidsafe Victoria's social media accounts and website, targeting Victorian parents and carers with important information on farm safety.

There are fantastic toy packs available for three lucky winners. Posters and collages will be judged in the same age and entry category. Entries will be judged on creativity, message clarity, originality and effort.

7. TIPS FOR CREATING ENTRIES

Remember to include and complete the slogan "I stay safe on the farm by ____" in your poster or collage entry! Download and print off the ready-made template in the links above which already includes the slogan for children to complete.



How to Create a Poster

A poster is a visual way to show information – it often contains an image, a tagline and a short safety message. Your poster could be created using a photo, illustration, painting or digital image (e.g. clipart). If you are using photos or clip art images, make sure you have permission to do so (make sure you do not have to purchase the rights or credit the original author of the images).

Try and make your poster colourful and eye catching so that it grabs people's attention and makes them want to read your message!





How to Create a Collage

A collage is an activity that involves cutting and pasting different craft materials onto a sheet of paper. With the assistance of an adult, children can also add to these by writing farm safety tips or messages beside their creations.

Preparation

Make sure you are prepared with all the right items to get started. These include:

- An A3 or A4 sheet of paper
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- A range of collage materials (e.g. pictures cut out from magazines or newspapers, scraps of paper, fabric or ribbon, pipe cleaners, pencils to colour in/write/draw and ice-cream sticks)



Ensure that you have a sturdy piece of paper for the base of the collage. Thicker paper is less likely to fall apart once you start gluing your materials on.

Gather all your materials and plan your final design. Do this by laying out the different materials on your paper without gluing them on. This will allow you to see if everything fits on the paper and if anything else needs to be added. Use different colours, shapes and textures to make your collage stand out!

To help you get started on your collage, download our cut-out sheet.
This includes farm images that you can print, cut out and colour to use for your collage.

- The poster or collage can be presented on either an A4 or A3 sheet of paper.
- Scan the poster or collage entries to send via email. A high-quality photograph will also be accepted if scanning is not possible.
- The poster can be hand-drawn, contain photos or be created digitally (e.g. using clip art images). If you are using photos or clip art images, make sure you have permission to do so (i.e. make sure you do not have to purchase the rights or credit the original author of the images).

11. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 6. To enter, the childhood centre/parent/guardian contact must email the entries in their appropriate format along with a completed entry form to info@kidsafevic.com.au as per instructions provided.
- 7. All competition entries received will be judged by an independent expert judging panel, based on the creativity and safety messages depicted.
- 8. Posters and collages will be judged in the same age and entry category.
- The judging panel's decision will be final and no communication will be entered into.
- 10. Winners will be contacted between 21/11/22 25/11/22 through the contact details provided in the entrant's competition entry form. Winning entries and winner details will also be posted on the Kidsafe Victoria website and other relevant platforms.
- 11. Prizes will be distributed to the early childhood centre or parent/guardian contact noted in the entry form via post and/or email.
- 12. Any prizes unclaimed by 02/12/2022 will go back into the prize pool and new winners will be selected from all entries received. No compensation will be provided to an early childhood centre or individual entrant that wins but does not claim their prize by the above date.
