**In Victoria, portable pools that can hold more than 30cm of water are legally required to be surrounded by a safety barrier.**

## **PORTABLE POOL SAFETY**

**Use this checklist to keep your kids safe in and around portable pools.**

- Ensure children are actively supervised by an adult at all times around water – within arm's reach for toddlers.
- Always empty the water out of the portable pool, and put away after use to prevent them from being refilled by rain or the sprinkler.
- Undertake CPR and first aid training and keep your skills updated regularly.
- Never rely on older children to supervise younger children.
- Check your local council's barrier requirements for your portable pool setup.
