Did you know that the injury risk to children aged 12 and under is nearly double when they are sitting in the front seat compared to the back seat? It is recommended that children aged 12 and under sit in the back row of seats where possible.

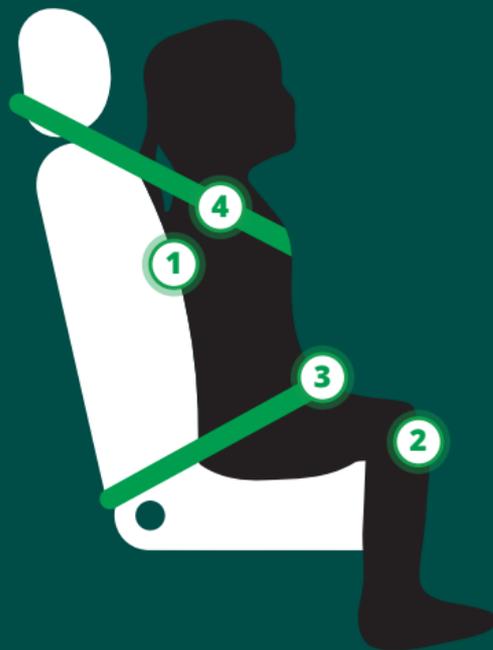
Is your child ready to move out of their booster seat?

The '**5 step test**' can be used to determine whether your child is big enough to get a good seatbelt fit.

BACK—firmly against the seat back

2

KNEES—bend comfortably over the front of vehicle seat

3

LAP BELT—sits low across the hips, touching the top of the thighs

4

SASH BELT—sits across the middle of the shoulder

5

TIME—can the child stay in this position for the whole trip?

If you answered **YES** to all of the 5 steps, **your child is ready** to travel using an adult seatbelt.

If you answered **NO** to any of the above steps, your **child should continue to use a booster seat.**
